Phase One: Data Gathering

Step One: Continue Landgrid Survey

Information Gathered:

- 1. Raw number of abandoned, vacant, distressed homes
- 2. Visualization of regions/areas of county where efforts can be concentrated
- 3. Tool for ongoing use by future BC Landbank
- 4. Analysis for land use, overlays of flood plains, ownership, and strategic planning for development
